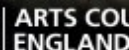

Message to All Parents 3-19

Please could all parents ensure that they report to the school's **Main Reception**. This applies to **all parents of pupils aged 3-19**.

All parents need to be aware that the 'Lower' School building is not a separate school with a separate reception area, and separate staff, it is part of the whole campus and there is **only one reception for all pupils**. Although parents of pupils in the Lower School building (Nursery - Y4) are permitted to enter the site to drop off and pick up at designated times of the day, at all other times, all parents and visitors of the school are required to report to the Main Reception area.

Please note that the Lower School building currently has 2 school teachers - Mrs Davies, Assistant Headteacher and Mrs Thomas, Assistant Leader of Lower School and both these members of staff teach pupils. Therefore, any issues during the school day need to be communicated via the school's Main Reception. Senior staff across the whole age-range will be available to assist, where there are issues needing urgent attention and where a pre-arranged meeting is not appropriate.

The following senior staff have responsibilities across the 3-19 age-range:

Mrs Thomas, Headteacher

Mr Ling, Deputy Headteacher

Mr Griffiths, Assistant Headteacher

Mrs Leftley, Assistant Headteacher (whole school responsibilities and *designated senior Line Manager to Lower School*)

Mrs Williams, Assistant Headteacher

Schools Essentials Grant for children looked after

The School Essentials Grant (SEG) is provided by the Welsh Government to all children looked after, and to children in households with lower incomes. The grant provides financial assistance for essential school items to help ensure that children have access to the necessary resources for their education, such as uniforms, stationery, and other school essentials. For 2024-25, the scheme is providing £125 per learner for all year groups up to Year 11, and £200 for learners in Year 7. School Attendance

We need you to.....

- Send your child to school on time.
- Ring/Text school early and daily if your child can not attend.
- Avoid holidays in term time.
- Keep school informed of your updated contact number.

We will.....

- Keep you regularly informed of your child's attendance.
- Treat any information you give us in a supportive and sensitive way.
- Welcome your child every day.
- Be happy that you have chosen to give your child the opportunity of the best future.

We understand that sometimes getting your children up and out on time every morning can be difficult, particularly if your child doesn't want to go for some reason.

We know that children who miss even small amounts of education can fall behind quickly and can miss out on so much. Being in school and on time increases learning and social opportunities.

Here are some ways you can help.

If you suspect that your child may be missing school or is unhappy at school, contact the school or the Inclusion Team who can help resolve any difficulties and offer friendly advice.

Make sure your child knows that you do not approve of them missing school for any reason, but be on the alert for any particular reasons for not attending school, like bullying, difficulties with school-work.

Make sure you know the school's attendance policy; every school has one.

If your child is away for other reasons like a doctor's appointment or the dentist, let the school know in advance. Please try and book appointments towards the end of the day.

Take an interest in your child's education, ask them what they did in school and celebrate their successes and listen to their worries.

If you can't help them, speak to the school and let them know of any difficulties.

If your child is absent get in touch with school. Staff will work with you to help improve the situation. It's better to contact us first so that we can make sure steps are taken to help you.

Make sure your child arrives on time to start school.
